# WRA 2014 Annual Meeting Report

The 47th Annual Meeting was productive and successful followed by a tasty barbecue and friendly neighbors catching up and getting acquainted. Congratulations to the fifteen percent of WRA members who chose to have their voices heard and voted electing Chris Hardy, Ben Larson and Jeff Sowell to the Board of Trustees.

Board meetings will now be on the third Wednesday of each month and in 2015 the Annual Meeting will be on the third Saturday of September. Most of the Bylaw amendments passed bringing the Bylaws into compliance with the RCWs and adding other changes to improve and protect the Association. Complete election results may be seen on the WRA Website or at the office.

Rimmers approved the 2014-2015 Budget and decided to up the Security Patrol to \$40 per lot (payable by Oct. 31) to hire King County officers to help protect our neighborhood. Patrols will continue without interruption.

### What's new with the Board?

Steve McDonald has been re-elected as Board president. Chris Hardy will serve as vice-president, with Kimberlea Miller as secretary and Donna Greathouse Neel returning as treasurer and chair of the Budget and Finance Committee. Once the officers were selected, President Steve McDonald appointed committee chairs. With the input of the trustees the following appointments were made: Communications, Jim Besso; Park, Matthew Rourke; Water Utilities, Ernie Henrie; Neighborhood Safety, Jeff Sowell; Special Events, Kimberlea Miller and Jessica Besso.

# WRA now has electronic billing!

FINALLY! Electronic billing options are here for WRA members! If you don't want to receive your bill through the U.S. mail, you can now sign up for paperless billing!

Starting in September, WRA can send you notice by email when your bill is available to securely view and pay online. It is a free, easy and secure way to be environmentally friendly and save time for yourself. We will have the ability for you to have your payments made automatically from your checking account or you can login and make your payments at your convenience. If you sign up for e-billing and the auto-pay option before September 10, 2014 you will receive a \$5 credit on your September 30, 2014 water bill! # Japanese Knotweed in the Rim

Japanese Knotweed is on the Washington quarantine list (prohibited plants list) and it is prohibited to transport, buy, sell, offer for sale, or to distribute plants or plant parts, seeds in packets, blends or "wildflower mixes" of this species, into or within the state of Washington.

Fill dirt may be contaminated with Japanese Knotweed and an infestation could take hold before it is even identified. King County has already treated several areas within Wilderness Rim but may not have the funds to assist further.


# Who Let the Dogs Out?


