King County—FEMA Grant Project

Beginning this summer, King County will start work on a flood mitigation project for Wilderness Rim funded by a FEMA grant. All project work is scheduled for summers, finishing in 2017. WRA Board of Trustees Changes

At the 2014 Annual Meeting, the membership voted to reduce the number of trustees from eleven to nine with a Bylaw amendment change. With the resignation of Vice President Chris Hardy and Treasurer Ben Larson, the Board was reduced to eight trustees. In April, Jeff Sowell



was elected Vice President. In a special May meeting, the trustees voted to appoint Wil Chromey back to the Board and elected Fernando Platin, Jr. to serve as treasurer. Both new officers will hold office until new officers are elected following the 2015 Annual Meeting in September. Mr. Chromey will serve his trustee appointment until September as well.

Both Chris and Ben will be missed for their contributions and willingness to serve their community. We wish them both the very best in their future endeavors.

No Water Shortage Expected in the Rim

Governor Inslee declared a statewide drought emergency on May 15th. Wilderness Rim residents need to continue conserving water, however, no wateruse restrictions are anticipated. The Morally Superior Toilet

Here is some Win-Win-Win advice: you can save money by lowing your water bill. You can enjoy a sense of accomplishment by learning a new, exciting skill that you can talk about at parties. You can feel the empowering satisfaction of moral superiority by contributing to a better world.

You can accomplish all of this by simply making sure your toilets are not leaking.

When a faucet or spigot is leaking, you can see the drips and puddles, but a toilet can leak for years without being noticed.

There are two types of toilet leaks: an overflowing tank and a leaking valve.

Overflowing Tank

If your toilet is never silent, it is probably overflowing. Inside the tank there is a plastic pipe that sticks straight up and is open at the top. If the water goes all the way to the top of that pipe, it is overflowing.

Leaking Valve

To see if the valve is leaking:

- 1) Put a few drops of a dark food coloring in the tank. If you don't have food coloring on hand, you may use dye strips that are available for free from the WRA office.
- 2) Wait for an hour.
- 3) Look for food coloring in the bowl.
