Good Turnout for Annual Meeting

Member participation generated nearly 100 ballots. A quorum was reached with mail-in ballots and another 35 members came in person to the 48th Annual Meeting. The two special assessments on the ballot were approved. The 2015-2016 Budget was approved as were all but one of the proposed amendments to WRA's Bylaws. The membership rejected the contact information Bylaw, which was proposed to align with the requirements of the Rules and Regulations of the WRA Water System.

Special Assessments Approved

Both the \$40 Security Patrol and the \$15 Playground Safety assessments were approved by the voting members at the 2015 Annual Meeting.



The \$40 Security Patrol per lot will be included on September bills and is used to hire off-duty King County Sheriff Deputies to randomly patrol Wilderness Rim through September of 2016.

The \$15 per lot Playground Safety assessment will be included on March 2016 bills. The enclosures around both play areas will be completed and the surface will be improved with twelve inches of pea gravel. Volunteers are needed to help with the playground improvement during the summer in 2016.

Election Results

Members voted to approve the Bylaw amendment to return the Board to eleven trustees. Incumbents returning are Wilfred Chromey, Donna Greathouse Neel, Joyce Jansen and Steve McDonald. Newly elected trustees are Mia Buse-Stone, Jessica LaBissoniere, and Lenny Stoltman.

Elected to the ARC are Doug Greathouse, Steve McDonald, and Fernando Platin, Jr. Election results are also on the <u>WRA website</u>.

Tree Trimming By King County

King County had crews in the area trimming back the overgrown vegetation at the road edges. Their maintenance methods have caused dozens of concerns from Rim residents. If your trees have limbs that have been battered or cut off in the middle the best



recommendation would be to seek professional tree service help or trim the branches back to the tree trunk to protect the health of your tree. WRA does not perform roadside maintenance on private property. Concerns should be directed to King County Roads at 206-296-8100.

Wilderness Rim Association has joined the Great American Shake Out and encourages you to join millions of people worldwide who will practice how to *Drop, Cover, and Hold On* at 10:15 a.m. on Thursday, October 15 during the *Great ShakeOut Earthquake Drills*. This means that wherever you are at that moment – at home, at work, at school, anywhere – you should *Drop, Cover, and Hold On* as if there were a major earthquake occurring at that very moment, and stay in this position for at least 60 seconds. No Shooting

Wilderness Rim is designated a no shooting zone by King
County and hunting is prohibited. At the September Board meeting, the
trustees made it part of WRA's regulations that all corporate properties are
off limits to hunting and to the discharge of any firearms or the use of
bows and arrows. This restriction was effective immediately and covers all
community areas including Cascade Park and the Greenbelt.

Toilet Leak Detection Program

Enclosed in this newsletter is a toilet test strip .The dye strip goes in your toilet tank and can be divided to be used in more than one toilet. The process is simple. You are encouraged to use the strips. They can help you save money if you have a leak. It also helps to keep the community in conformance with goals to reduce wasted drinking water and to keep the water consumption reasonable.

Cracking Down on Backyard Eggs

Keeping chickens and ducks is prohibited by the Wilderness Rim
Restrictive Covenants. This is the number one complaint received by the WRA
Board of Trustees forcing action against this fowl enterprise. Residents with foul
birds must immediately find new homes for their egg layers before civil action is
directed at the homeowner. A significant concern is that rodents and predators
are attracted to the area by these birds, eggs and their food. This is a
violation of State law. Every member has the right to speak to a neighbor who is
violating this covenant to remind them they are breaking the rule and possibly
creating a nuisance, which is also a violation of the Restrictive Covenants.



Lead & Copper Test Results

In July, water samples collected from nine Wilderness Rim homes and the WRA Office were tested by Water Management Laboratories, Inc. in Tacoma for lead and copper. These two harmful substances may be present in drinking water after exposure to home water pipes.

WRA drinking water is safe and well below any actionable level either by Washington State or federal standards. This test is conducted every three years. Results are posted on the <u>Department of Health website</u>.

Financial Audit Completed

The Independent Auditors' Report for WRA's Financials is available to WRA members <u>online</u>. For the third year in a row, WRA received a clean audit opinion.



Testing for E-coli

WRA drinking water is tested monthly for the presence of coliform and E-coli bacteria. All recent tests have come back clean and are available online. Brewster Lake also has tested below actionable levels for E-coli, but please remember that the lake is **not** drinking water.

Eggs Missing?

If you're wondering where your eggs went – they may have made an appearance on your neighbor's car. The acid in the egg and scratches caused by the shell can cause permanent paint and finish damage requiring a complete paint job costing thousands of dollars. Egging cars is a crime so call 911 if this happens to your vehicle. When the egg thrower is arrested, charges can be anywhere from disorderly conduct, littering, and vandalism. Punishment can be from community service, to restitution, to jail time producing a criminal record for the offender. Crack down on this foul behavior.
