

Bear Sightings and Washington Law

Please remember to secure your garbage cans, be watchful of your children, and do not approach or feed any bear. If you see a bear in Wilderness Rim, first call 911 to report the sighting and then contact the WRA Office. The 911 dispatcher will notify both the Sheriff's Department and the Department of Fish and Wildlife. Please review Washington State Law RCW 77.15.790 prohibiting attracting large wild carnivores.

Barking and Other Doggie Downers



Last year WRA installed five Dog Waste Stations in the Park. Please be respectful to our neighborhood and clean up after your pet. Also if you are turning your dog out now that the weather is better please be sure to check with your neighbors to know that your pets aren't a nuisance by barking in your absence.

If you are bothered by a barking dog (or a symphony of them) please politely bring it to your neighbor's attention with a short visit or a polite note on their door(s). Allowing dogs to be a nuisance with barking is a violation of Wilderness Rim Covenants and King County ordinances for noise and animal control. Please be a good neighbor and control your best furry friends.

Public Transportation Options in the Rim



Snoqualmie Valley Transportation (SVT) has expressed interest in adding weekday bus service into Wilderness Rim. The possibility of having two established bus stops in the Rim is in part dependent on the amount of ridership and interest shown by community

members. Wilderness Rim residents have the opportunity to voice their opinions and possibly obtain regular route service around the main loop multiple times per day during the week. Financial Update and Playground Assessment

Eight months into this fiscal year, WRA remains on track with budget projections for both revenue and expenses. In particular, the Park Committee is pleased to report that the upcoming capital repair projects for this summer should be funded from money




saved through tight expense control and volunteer help in the park. In addition, the safety improvement project for the playgrounds will be funded by the \$15 Special Assessment included on the March bills. The \$10,000 collected plus the \$1500 grant from King County is to bring both Park playgrounds up to OSHA standards for safety with much of the work being done by volunteers. The barrier surround will be completed on both playgrounds and the ground within will be covered with

twelve inches of pea gravel. This playground improvement will provide a safer play area and reduce WRA's injury liability. Volunteers to help with this project are urgently needed to keep costs down. Anyone with construction experience or willingness to help is encouraged to meet with the Park Committee to help with this project for WRA kids.

Revenue for water billings are as expected and with the change in the maintenance of the water system, expenses are anticipated to be below original projections.
